## Details

Dean Isbister was a civilian employed by Pacific Sheet Metal Works Ltd. On February 18<sup>th</sup> 1943, he was assisting in roofing a building at RCAF Station Patricia Bay, when he fell 20 ft to the ground and was killed. The circumstances of the accident were investigated and at the inquest a verdict of accidental death was returned. He was buried at Royal Oak Burial Park on February 23<sup>rd</sup>.

Dean was born in Victoria B.C., on 30 August 1921 to Thomas Isbister and Ruth Speers. As well as his parents, he was survived by two brothers and two sisters.

### **City Man Killed On Building Job**

Wesley D. Isbister, 1752 Davie Street, an employee of the Pacific Sheet Metal Works, Limited, was killed yesterday afternoon at Patricia Bay, apparently having fallen from a building on which he was working. An inquest will be held.

Born in Victoria twenty-one years ago, he attended Central Junior High School, and was employed in the staples department at David Spencer, Limited, until late last year when he joined the sheet metal firm.

Surviving are his mother, Mrs. Ruth Isbister, with whom he lived; his father, in Elstow, Sask.; two brothers, Alex, in Dickson, Alta., and George, in Elstow; two sisters, Mrs. T. W. Chapman, 856 Darwin Avenue, Saanich, and Mrs. Thomas English, Two Hills, Alta.
