Biography

Reginald Keith Manttan was born on 16 August 1919 in Brisbane, Queensland, Australia to Reginald Francis Ryan Manttan and Dorothy Marion Threlfall. There were either two or three other children in the family.

Reginald, whose peacetime occupation was as a clerk, was enlisted in Brisbane on 14 September 1941. He was sent to Canada for the British Commonwealth Air Training Plan and arrived in San Francisco on MV Klipfontein on 3 October 1942. He was one of a group of 30 RAAF on the ship.

He was Navigator on Handley Page Hampden P5433 when it crashed into Saanich Inlet on 14 March 1943. Reginald's body was not recovered and he is commemorated on the Commonwealth Air Force Memorial in Ottawa.

Details of Crash

On 14 March 1943, Handley Page Hampden P5433 carried a crew of four; two Canadians and two Australians:

The purpose of the flight was to practice low flying over water at night.

The aircraft was seen to crash into the water in Saanich Inlet. The cause of the crash was not apparent. It was suggested an earlier accident with this Hampden could have had some bearing on it, but this was dismissed. The only body recovered was that of the pilot.
